On Saturday, December 3rd, the **ARLINGTON PARADE OF LIGHTS** will make its way through downtown Arlington. The Federation will have a float entered in the parade, and will be a bit different than in past years. Our Papoose-aged kids really enjoy this event. Make sure that you go out and pick up some lights for them to wear while they're riding on the float. The parade will start at 6:00 p.m., so we will need to congregate at the parade staging area ***no later than 5:30 p.m.*** I WILL NEED VOLUNTEERS to come out to Gene Hubble's shop on Friday, December 2, starting at 9:00 a.m. to assemble the float, and stay as long as you can. A more detailed message will be sent out the end of November from your Tribal Chiefs, so stay tuned!

On Sunday, December 11, we will have the annual **PAPOOSE CHRISTMAS PARTY** at the Central YMCA community room from 1:00-4:00. We will have a catered lunch, merriment, games and crafts for the kids, and a toy drive. 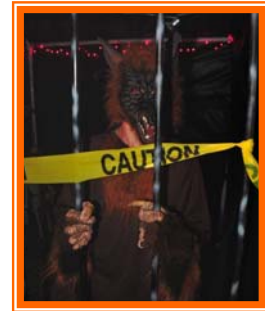
Like always, this is your program! It only gets better with your participation and input. Let me, or any other leadership person, know your thoughts.

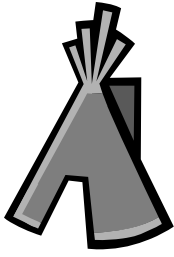
